

Why Are Termites a Concern?

Termites feed on wood & other cellulose-based materials and can cause structural damage over time. Moisture, wood-to-soil contact, poor drainage & wood debris around the structure can increase termite risk.

Before Your Technician Arrives:

- ☐ **Let us know if you have seen mud tubes, swarmers, discarded wings, damaged wood, or other signs of termite activity.**
- ☐ **Do not disturb or remove suspected termite evidence** before it can be inspected.

After Treatment:

- ☐ **Repair plumbing leaks** & address areas with excessive moisture.
- ☐ **Keep wood, firewood & debris** away from the structure.
- ☐ **Keep gutters, downspouts & drainage** functioning properly.
- ☐ **Maintain appropriate separation** between soil, mulch & structural wood where practical.
- ☐ **Keep crawl spaces & other areas** appropriately dry.
- ☐ **Report new** mud tubes, swarmers, discarded wings, or suspected damage promptly.

What to Expect:

Termite management is different from controlling a nuisance insect. Control involves treatment, monitoring & regular assessments of the property.

A lack of visible termites does not necessarily mean there is no activity. Termites can remain hidden within or around the structure.
