

Why Are Spiders Around Your Home?

Spiders are predators, so their presence often means there is a food source nearby—typically other insects. They may be found around exterior lights, doors & windows, garages, sheds, landscaping, eaves, & undisturbed storage areas.

Before Your Technician Arrives:

- ☐ **Let us know where you are seeing the most spider activity or webs.** This can help us identify areas that may need attention.
- ☐ **Remove** visible webs & egg sacs when practical.
- ☐ **Vacuum low and high.** Vacuum dark corners, under furniture & ceiling edges to remove hidden egg sacs.
- ☐ **Keep exterior lights off** when not needed to reduce insects that attract spiders.
- ☐ **Remove unnecessary items** from affected areas.

After Treatment:

- ☐ **Repair damaged screens** & seal obvious gaps around doors, windows, & other openings.
- ☐ **Continue removing** accessible webs & egg sacs as needed.
- ☐ **Keep vegetation trimmed** away from the structure & avoid creating dense, undisturbed areas against the building.
- ☐ **Keep door & window seals** in good condition to reduce entry points.
- ☐ **Avoid handling** unfamiliar spiders.

What to Expect:

Seeing an occasional spider does not necessarily indicate an infestation. Spider activity can fluctuate with weather, seasonal conditions, & the availability of insects.
