

Flies in Your Home? Here's How You Can Help.

Flies are attracted to food, garbage, pet waste, moisture & decaying organic material. Some species breed indoors, while others enter from outside.

Before Your Technician Arrives:

- ☐ **Let us know where you are seeing the most fly activity.** If flies repeatedly appear in one area, that can help us locate a potential source.
- ☐ **Empty garbage** & clean trash containers. Check recycling containers for food residue.
- ☐ **Clean food spills**, spoiled food & other organic material promptly. Keep food covered when possible.
- ☐ **Sanitize** affected areas & wipe down surfaces where heavy fly activity has been present.
- ☐ **Clean garbage disposals & drains.**
- ☐ **Clean pet areas**, including solid waste in the yard.

After Treatment:

- ☐ **Continue keeping food**, garbage & other potential food sources covered or contained.
- ☐ **Keep drains & garbage disposals clean** to reduce organic buildup.
- ☐ **Keep doors closed** when practical & repair damaged screens to reduce fly entry.
- ☐ **Address moisture problems**, leaks & standing water.

What to Expect:

Adult flies may continue to appear until their breeding sources are eliminated.

Recurring fly activity usually has a source. Continued activity may indicate that eggs or immature stages were already present or that another source remains. Removing food, moisture & breeding conditions is an important part of long-term control.
